When and where will the race be held?

The Standard Chartered Jersey Marathon will be held on **Sunday 1 October 2023.** The start and finish point is at Weighbridge Place, St Helier. The Marathon starts at 09.00hrs, the **Ravenscroft Relay Race at 09.30hrs** and the Marathon Mile starts at 10.00hrs

Where is the Marathon Village?

The Marathon Village is located at Weighbridge Place, St. Helier. Please see a map here.

Where do I collect my race pack?

Please note that we do not post race packs to runners, runners must collect their race packs from Registration, which is located in the Marathon Village. Registration is open at the following times:

Thursday 28th September 10:00-16:00 Friday 29th September 10:00-16:00

Saturday 30th September 10:00-16:00 (extended hours for Overseas Competitors only

until 18:00)

Is there a warm up?

Yes. There will be a short 5-minute relay warm up session in Liberation Square at 09:10am that we encourage all relay runners to attend and warm up before the race!

Getting To / From Relay Stations

It is **vitally important that all Relay Runners use the free coach transfers** to and from each Relay Station and check in on, or before the stated check-in time for each Relay Station.

The amount of traffic on the roads around and near Relay Stations has now become a significant issue for organizers, runners, and our marshals. Therefore, for safety reasons, we must now enforce that all Relay Runners arrive/depart from Relay Stations using our free coaches.

Please review the below table to see when your coaches depart and return for your designated Relay Station.

Please note that in 2023, there will be additional road closures around Relay Station 1 (Waterworks Valley) and Relay Station 2 (St Ouen) and so it will not be possible to be dropped off or collected by car at either station. Please note also at Relay Station 2 in St Ouen, the Parish Hall car park will be closed.

For Relay Station 2 (Leg 3 runners) – St Ouen, there will be an additional free coach departing from Les Quennevais School Car Park in St Brelades to Relay Station 2 in St Ouen.

Where do I leave my bag?

This is one of most commonly asked questions for the relay race, so please read these instructions very carefully!

If bags are not collected at the Stations points they will be returned to the Baggage Tent at Weighbridge Place. Getting bags back to the weighbridge can take a long time due to the heavy traffic on race day and whilst we endeavour to get them back to the weighbridge on race day, we cannot guarantee to runners exactly what time they will arrive. Therefore, please try and communicate with your team and organize yourselves and your bags accordingly to save yourselves any unnecessary waiting time. Those bags that are not collected on Race Day will be taken to 3D Events, 1 Waterloo Street, St.Helier, JE2 4WT.

If one of my team members drop out at the last minute can we still compete?

If someone drops out at the last minute and you can't find a substitute, one of your team members may choose to run two legs of the race. Please note that in this instance the team will not be eligible for a prize. If this happens inform a Race Official at your Stations point.





Can I make a substitute at the last minute?

Yes. If you make a substitute at the last minute, it is the Team Captain's responsibility to inform the Information Desk at the start of the race. Substitutes must sign the Declaration before they are eligible to run. In this situation the team would still be eligible for a prize. Please do not make substitutions without informing the Race Organisers and without the substitute signing the Declaration.

What if one of the runners drops out on the course?

If one of your team has to drop out during the course of their Relay Race leg for any reason they **must contact a marshal**. If they require medical assistance the marshal will arrange this. The marshal will also ensure that the next Relay Race Stations point is aware of the situation and that the awaiting team member is informed. The team can continue to run the race but will not be eligible for a prize.

Is there a baton that we have to pass between runners?

Yes, a red wristband will be passed between runners as a baton.

Where does the race number go?

Each relay race runner will have <u>two</u> numbers, a coloured number for the front and one for the back. You must pin your race number on the front and back of your race top. Safety pins will be available for collection when you pick up your race pack. Front numbers have emergency information on the reverse. Please complete the necessary emergency details before the race. Please do not swap race numbers with your team members as this could compromise medical treatment should an emergency arise.

Are you allowed to alter your race bib?

It is against the rules of the race to amend your race bibs in anyway, if you do amend your race bibs runners may face disqualification. This year race bibs will be a standard size and measure 220mm width X 210mm height, please ensure your race outfits will allow your race bib to fit comfortably on your front of your race top.

Which side of the road do I run on?

Runners <u>MUST</u> stay on the left hand side of the road unless directed otherwise by the Police or by a Race Official. Your safety is paramount and failure to comply with this rule will not only put yourself and others at risk but will also potentially lead to your disqualification from the race as per Rule 215 of the UKAA.

Are the roads going to be closed?

Not all of them. The roads in town will be closed during the start of the race and the St Aubin's inner road will be closed up to Mont Felard between approximately 08.45hrs and 10.45hrs. On other areas of the course the Honorary Police will control traffic to minimise the impact on the runners and to ensure that the race is safe for participants and the public alike.





This means you will be running with the traffic for much of the course. Please ensure that you stay aware of the traffic and follow the instructions of the Honorary Police and the Marshals – they are there for your safety. For full details on road closure, please click <u>here</u>.

Will the Ravenscroft Relay Race be timed?

Yes. The BibTag technology will be used for both the Marathon and the Relay Race and times will be available on the website within 48hrs of the race. For 2023, there will be no split time for the relay legs, only a total team time.

Teams of Five: Only the first and last runners' bib will have a timing chip embedded into it. The 2nd, 3rd and 4th runner will have a bib that looks similar but DOES NOT have a timing chip in it. In order to get a chip time, the first and last runner must be wearing the embedded chip bibs.

Teams of Two: Both race bibs will have timing chips embedded into them.

How are times recorded?

Times will be recorded in two ways - Gun Time and Chip Time.

- The Gun Time is the time from the sound of the starter's signal to the time when the runner crosses the finish line. Also known as the Official Time.
- The Chip Time is the time from when the first runner crosses the starting mats at the start line, to the time when the final stage runner crosses the finishing mats.

Where is my timing chip?

The timing chip will be embedded into two of the race bibs. These chipped bibs need to be with the first and last relay runner and worn on the front. Please see the image of the back of the bib to show you what you should expect.

How are winners determined?

Gun time is the Official Time and all awards are based on Gun Time.



This is based on the International Associations of Athletics Federations (IAAF) Road Race Handbook, an excerpt explains the decision:

"For road races and road walking events, the official time will be the time elapsed between the start gun and the athlete reaching the finish line. However, if an athlete crosses the start line after the start gun, his time elapsed between the start and finish line can be made





known to the athlete but will not be considered as official time. The order in which athletes reach the finish line will be considered as the official finish position."

Will the team times be on the website?

Yes. Times will be published on the website within 48hrs of the race.

Can I run with headphones/earphones in?

No headphones/earphones are allowed on the course, except Bone Conductor Headphones as these do not obstruct the runners ability to hear instructions in anyway. This is for your safety, as the race is not on entirely closed roads. If you are listening to music you may not hear traffic or the instructions of the Police and Race Officials. This is clearly stated in the Official Race Rules and you may face disqualification if you do wear such equipment, as this is not covered in the event insurance policy. Police and marshals are instructed to remind you to remove any headphones, so please respect their actions. Any reported mistreatment of marshals from runners will likely lead to disqualification.

Can I rollerblade or cycle during the race?

No. No wheeled transport is allowed on the course. The Official Race Rules outline the details of what is permitted.

Can my friends follow me on their bikes?

No. This is against UK athletics rules and therefore runners who are being followed by friends on bikes could face disqualification from the race.

Can I bring along my dog to run with me?

Pets are not allowed on the course.

Will there be medical assistance?

Yes. St John's Ambulance are supporting the event and will have first aid personnel at each Relay Race Stations point plus full medical support at the start and finish and via their ambulances on the route. There is also a doctor on the finish line.

Will there be water stations around the course and at the finish line?

Yes. There will be twelve water stations at regular intervals along the course. There will also be water at the finish for those running the final leg.

Are energy drinks provided?

Unfortunately, they are not provided for relay runners. You may see them on the course, but these are for runners in the full marathon.





Are there toilets on the course?

Yes. There are toilets at the start and finish of the race and at each Relay Race Stations. Additionally, there are a number of public toilets around the course.

What are the race categories?

Teams of Two

First place teams of two will be awarded a trophy each in the following categories:

- Male
- Female
- Mixed

Teams of Five

First place teams of five will be awarded a trophy each and second and third place teams will be awarded one team trophy in the following categories:

- Male
- Female
- Mixed

The Industry Cup categories are:

When will the prizes be given out?

Prizes for the Marathon, Ravenscroft Relay Race and Marathon Mile will be awarded at 15:00hrs at a prize giving to be held in the Marathon Village marquee.

What facilities are there at the relay stations?

The following will be available at each Stations point:

- 1. Water supplies (Jersey Water container)
- 2. Marquee for bag drop/collection and for shelter
- Toilets
- 4. PA system with BBC Radio Jersey coverage
- 5. A team of lovely helpful marshals





Will there be changing areas and showers facilities?

- **Start/ Finish** There will be changing facilities within the Marathon Village that are open from 11:00. The shower facilities at St Helier Marina will be open between the hours of 11:00 16:00. You will find them a short walking distance from the finish line.
- Relay changeover over 1 / Waterworks Valley No changing facilities
- Relay changeover over 2 / St. Ouens No changing facilities
- Relay changeover over 3 and 4 / Les Quennevais Changing facilities available within Les Quennevais Sports Centre.

What do I do with my sponsorship money?

Most sponsorship money is collected online, however if you have collected funds manually then please bring your sponsorship money in the form of a cheque, made payable to 'The Jersey Marathon Trust', with you to Registration when you collect your race pack.

If you are unable to collect your sponsorship money by Race Day, please arrange for a cheque made payable to 'The Jersey Marathon Trust' to be sent to the Race Organisers, Standard Chartered Jersey Marathon, C/O 3D Events, 1 Waterloo Street, St Helier, JE2 4WT.
