NOTICE OF CLOSING OF PUBLIC ROADS

The Constable's of St. Helier, St. Lawrence, St. John. St. Mary, St Ouen, St. Peter and St. Brelade, in accordance with Article 67 of the Road Traffic (Jersey) Law 1956 (as amended), authorise that certain roads, as set out below, be closed or restricted in their use between 8am and 4pm on Sunday 5th October 2025 for the occasion of the Standard Chartered Jersey Marathon. Additionally, the flow of traffic on these roads may be restricted in certain directions during this period of time.

St. Helier identified Roads:

The town route covers quite a number of roads, which will be closed for short periods of time between 7.30am and 11.15am. There will be some delays whilst the main race starts at 9.00am and also for the relay race, which starts at 9.30am and then the Marathon Mile starts at 10am.

Consent is also given for a number of authorised vehicles accompanying the runners to travel along Queens Street and King Street between 9.00am and 11.00am for the purpose of escorting those runners along that part of the course set aside for the said event.

St. Aubin's inner road will be closed from West Park to Mont Felard and traffic will not be able to go out of town on the Inner Road from 9am through until 10.15am.

Tyneville Lane is closed from 8.30am until 10am access to premises from St Aubin's Inner Road.

Access to Fort Regent and Pier Road

Car Park from 8.30am until 3.30pm should be via La Collette, from 11.30am you can access only from Bond Street.

The start and Finish is taking place on Weighbridge Square so this will mean that there will be delays as the runners comes along Commercial Street into Wharf Street cross Mulcaster Street into Weighbridge Square and are closed from **7.30am until 3pm please take alternative routes.**

No Parking St Helier

From Saturday 4 October 2pm until Sunday 5 October at 6pm the following roads will have no parking:

Weighbridge Place, Mulcaster Street, Hill Street, York Street from the Junction of Broad Street to Seale Street and Wharf Street.

Buses

Eastbound buses will terminate from 9am till 3pm at Liberation Station. Eastbound buses coming into town will come through the tunnel and avoid Snow Hill due to road closure. Westbound buses will operate as normal.

Taxis

The taxi rank at Weighbridge Place is going to be out of use from 8am until 6pm. A temporary rank for the day is going to be in front of the Pomme D'or Hotel. The taxi rank at Snow Hill will be closed until 11am and the Library Place taxi rank will be restricted until about 10:30.

St.Lawrence

Waterworks Valley will be closed from Hamptonne all the way down to St. Aubin's inner road. Traffic will not be permitted to come down the valley from 8.45am to 10.30am.

St.Mary and St.John

The road which travels from St. Mary's Country Inn through to St. John's Manor will be closed in one direction. Traffic will not be permitted to travel from St. Mary to St. John on this road, La Rue De Bel Air, from 9.15am until 12.00 noon.

At the junction of Les Chenolles and Route de Carrefour a Cendre, traffic will be diverted right towards St Mary for access to Greve De Lecq.

St.Ouen

St Parish of Ouen's is a heavily congested area on the Marathon route, as runners pass through the parish roads in both directions between 9:30am and 12:30pm. A significant number of roads will be closed on Sunday 5 October to help facilitate a safe race for runners. Please make alternative travel arrangements on Sunday 5 October 2025 to avoid facing significant travel delays. Thank you for your support!

The main road of La Route De Vinchelez will be closed heading north at the junction of La Route de Trodez and La Rue De La Croix. All traffic (except buses and residents living in La Rue de la Capelle) will be diverted down La Route de Trodez to Les Landes School before re-joining La Route De Vinchelez.

La Rue De La Croix will be closed from the junction of Le Chemin De L'Eglise and La Route De Vinchelez.

La Ronche and La Rue Platte Raie will be closed from La Route de Trodez.

La Ronde Cotte will be closed from Route de Millais.

La Croiserie will be closed in both directions.

La Rue de la Capelle will be closed from La Route De Vinchelez.

Rue de la Forge will be closed from La Grande Route de St. Ouen.

Rue Militaire will be closed heading east towards St Mary, at the Junction of Rue de la Croix and Le Chemin de L'Eglise.

The Parish Hall car park will be closed to all traffic between 9.30am and 11.30am.

Access to St Ouen Village will be restricted. There will be no through road to St Mary or Greve de Lecq, when heading north from St Peter. At the junction of La Grande Route de St. Ouen and Rue de la Pointe and the junction of La Grande Route de St. Ouen and Grand Route Route des Augerez, all traffic will be diverted right for St Mary and Greve de Lecq.

Spectating: Organisers **strongly advise** that no spectators should travel by car to St Ouen to watch the race due to traffic congestion and under no circumstances should supporters try and follow (by car, motor bike or bicycle) friends or family members who are running in the race, as this could be deemed as an unfair advantage and the runner being supported could face disqualification.

Spectators should all support from a static location on the side of the road, in one of our stated spectator zones.

St.Peter

La Neuve Route will be closed so there will be no access onto La Grande Route De St. Pierre and this will be from 10 am to 2 pm. La Rue Des Sapins will also be closed from 10am to 2pm. La Rue De St. Clement off La Route De Beaumont will be closed and access only to the Parish Hall via La Rue De L'Eglise from 10am to 2.30pm.

On L'Avenue De La Reine Elizabeth II motorists are advised that there will be delays at the roundabout at the entrance to the airport as runners cross. This will be from 10 am to approximately 2pm. Please give yourself extra time if you need to access the airport.

Due to the traffic congestion in St Ouen village and the long diversion in place via Les Landes school for access to Greve De Lecq and St Mary. Access to Greve de Lecq and St Mary will be signposted on the junction of La Grande Route de Saint-Pierre heading North along Grande Route des Augerez.

St.Brelade

Rue du Pont Marquet at Petite Route des Mielles & Rue des Mans will be closed from 6am to 2.30pm.

Again, please exercise caution with regard to the Railway Walk from Les Quennevais Playing Fields out to Corbiere and down to St. Aubins. There will be a police car and time clock car leading the first runner along this route, followed by the rest of the runners, and we ask that you give way to them to ensure their safety.

St Ouen Bay Area

Please avoid La Pulente between 10am and 3pm and take Le Mont A La Brune instead.

Corbiere Area

No Right turn onto La Rue Du Sud and La Rue De La Corbiere from La Route Des Camps, La Rue Baal and Les Fourneaux Estate this is from 10.00am until 2.00pm

St. Aubin's Harbour Area

It is asked if you are going to Red Houses, please take La Haule (Le Moat Au Roux) and avoid St Aubins Village between 10.30am and 3.00pm.

There will be no parking at St. Brelade Parish Hall from midnight until Sunday at 5pm. Traffic delays in the village from 10.30am until 3pm.

Be aware of traffic delays as the runners come off the Railway Walk and go around the back of the Parish Hall.

Other Points

The condition of this consent is that Honorary Police Officers and marshals policing the event shall be in such a position at all road closure points to direct motorists to alternative routes in order to allow them to continue their journey with the least delay possible.

We would much appreciate the co-operation of motorists when approaching or overtaking the runners whilst on the public roads. Please be aware of runners and give way to them.

Vehicles on Railway Walk and Cycle Track on Promenade

Finally, just to remind cyclists and pedestrians to be aware of the initial police motorcycle, time clock car as they come along the railway walk and St Aubin promenade (pavement and cycle track) to the finish which is at Weighbridge Square.

There will also be other medical and logistical vehicles on the railway walk and promenade before, during and after the race. So members of the public should stay aware through the day.
